Seniors & Parents: Scholarship time is here! Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

Here's where you can find scholarships:

- *ScholarshipQuest* at EducationQuest.org features over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
- Your school counselor's office website. Our list of local scholarships is posted on the school website under the "Counselor" tab. Click on the link that says "go here to my website." From there, find the Scholarship tab and they will all be listed. Make sure you 'download' the documents and save them to your computer so they stay formatted correctly. I have included a local checklist on my page to help you keep track of each scholarship and the requirements. This document is only for your benefit and does not need to be turned into me. Please notice due dates and requirements for each scholarship. Do not wait until the last minute to start

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these! If you need letters of recommendation, make sure you give your recommenders plenty of time to write a letter (a minimum two week notification is ideal)!

- The college you plan to attend. Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and application procedures.
- National search sites such as College Board, Peterson's and Chegg.
- Other resources could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.

Juniors & Parents: All juniors will be taking the ACT test at school on April 3rd as part of state testing (free of charge). If you want to take an additional ACT test this spring, you must register by March 9 for the April 14th test or by May 4th for the June 9th test. To register, go online to www.actstudent.org. If you would like to request a fee waiver, contact Ms. Hermsmeier. All Meridian students have FREE access to the On To College (formerly John Baylor ACT Test Prep program). Contact Ms. Hermsmeier if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity for the spring tests! Note that all juniors will be preparing for the April 3rd test using a form of ACT prep.

Juniors: it's time to find the right fit for college! Here's how to get started:

- 1. Attend a college fair to meet with representatives from colleges that interest you. Upcoming fairs include:
 - Lincoln Area College Fair Sunday, April 22, 1-3 p.m. – Southeast Community College – Lincoln
 - Tri-State Area College Fair Sunday, April 15, 1-3 p.m. – Marina Center – South Sioux City, Nebraska
 - Omaha Area College Fair Sunday, April 29, 1-3 p.m. University of Nebraska Omaha Sapp Fieldhouse

Before you attend, register for a barcode at NebraskaCollegeFairs.org.

Print the barcode (or download it to your smartphone) and take it to the fair. College reps will scan it to retrieve your demographic information – and you won't have to complete their information cards.

2. Schedule a campus visit. All juniors may have two excused absences to take a college visit! Schedule your visit through the counseling office to ensure your absence is excused. In addition to your two excused days of school, your upcoming spring break is also a good time to visit schools that interest you.
