Meridian's winter sports schedules have now concluded. We want to congratulate Jackson Huls for finishing 3rd at districts and qualifying for state. Jackson competed well against 2 quality opponents at state.

The girls' basketball team finished the year with a hard fought game at Davenport but lost to Deshler 26-36 in Sub-Districts. The 15-9 season included a 3 way first place tie for conference regular season champions. Congratulations to the team on breaking the record for regular season defensive points allowed as the record was set last year with 38.2 and this year was set at 33.66 points per game. Ally Kort set the record for career 3 pointers with 95 and the free throw percentage for a season with over 50 attempts, she was 58 – 75 at 77.33%.

The boys' basketball team began their sub-district play this week at Davenport with a first round win against Dorchester. The Mustangs met the BDS Eagles in the following round, ending their season on a 55-28 loss. The boys worked hard and never gave up. Congratulations, Jacob Dennis for breaking the school record for the most 3 pointers made in a season! Good job to all of the coaches and players on a season well played .

As spring arrives, we have numerous activities the students will be involved in like track, FBLA, FFA, Show Choir, district music and many more. Please stay aware of your students grades and how they are proceeding. The 3rd quarter will conclude on March 9th.

Roll call was taken: Vorderstrasse-Present, Niederklein-present, Sobotka-present, Rut-present, and Bartels-present. Also present were Superintendent Kort and Principal Scott.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Niederklein moved and Sobotka seconded to excuse Scheer from the meeting. Vote Taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were made by the public.

SENIORS:

Stay on track for college by completing these second-semester tasks:

- **Watch your grades.** If you slack off and get poor grades, your college admission could be revoked.
- **Complete the financial aid process.** By now, you should have filed your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). If you haven't, apply at fafsa.gov. If your college requests verification of your FAFSA information, you must submit required documents before the school will award financial aid.
- **Watch your student portal and email closely.** Once you're accepted for admission, the colleges you listed on your FAFSA will notify you of the financial aid they're offering.
- **Apply for scholarships.** Local scholarships as well as state/regional scholarships are available on the counselor's website. You can see ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org to find Nebraska-based scholarships. You'll also find links to national scholarship sites that are EducationQuest-approved.
- **Make your final college selection.** Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.



- **Be aware of deadlines** to accept financial aid and college admission offers, submit your housing deposit, and register for new-student orientation.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

Local scholarships have been updated and are available on the school website under the administration-counselor tab. Students also have all scholarships in their google classroom. Many of the scholarships are due April 15th, but students have been encouraged to start on them now. If you have questions about a scholarship, please ask! Remember, additional scholarships can be found on the counselor website, and students are encouraged to check it often! Seniors and Parents...Please make sure you inform the counseling office of any scholarships you receive.

JUNIORS...it's time to narrow your college choices.

Narrow your college choices soon to prepare for these upcoming activities:

- **ACT Test.** When you take the ACT this spring, you'll be asked to provide a list of colleges that should receive your score. Note: All juniors will take the state ACT free of charge on March 22.
- **Completion of the FAFSA** early next fall. You and your parents can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1 of your senior year. The colleges you list on the form will receive the results.
- **College applications.** Early next fall, it will be time to apply to your top college choices. Meridian will hold an Apply2College event early next fall.

IT'S COLLEGE VISIT TIME!

Spring is a great time for juniors to take an individual tour of a college of interest! Many schools offer "Junior Visit Days," or an individual tour can be arranged. Please see Ms. Hermsmeier if you need help in setting up a visit. Remember, every junior and senior is allowed two excused absences to visit colleges. Questions to ask during your visit are also available from the counselor's office.

17 & 18 YEAR OLD MALES:

The law requires that all males must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. It is now possible to submit registration information early, as long as the person is at least 17 years and 3 months old. Selective Service will keep your

information on file and process it automatically within 30 days of your 18th birthday. To find out more information go to <https://www.sss.gov>. You can also register online.

2021-2022 CLASS REGISTRATION:

Over the next month, I will be meeting with each student in grades 8-11 to register for classes for next year. For next year's juniors and seniors, taking dual credit college classes may be an option. These students may also take college classes as part of SENCAP (Southeast Community College's Career Academy). These are great opportunities for students to obtain college credit while still in high school! As always, feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.

PRE-K AND KINDERGARTEN PARENTS' MEETINGS

Meridian 2022 Driver's Education Class

The Driver's Education Class is certified through the State of Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles. **To take this class you will need to be 14 before October 14.** The student will need to pass both the driving and the written part of the class with a minimum grade of 80%. The class will consist of 30-36 hours of online instruction, 5 hours of

supervised practice driving, and a 10-15 minute driving test. The lecture part of the class will be the AAA How To Drive Online Course. You will need to email me at dean.filipi@cmwolves.net to sign up for the class. The fee for the class is \$295. Payment will be needed before you receive your pass code for the online class. Once you have completed the practice driving part of the course we will meet in Exeter to take the driving test. Once you have completed the online class and email me the Certificate of Completion, I will enter you into the DMV system. We will do the driving part of the class this summer.
