Nothing new was added to the agenda.

- 1. **Apply to your top college choices.** Meridian participates in Nebraska's *Apply2College* campaign in October, so you'll get help with your college applications during a school-day event.
- 2. Create an FSA ID. You and a parent must each create a username and password at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u> that will serve as your Federal Student

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Aid (FSA) IDs for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You will each need your own email address to create an FSA ID.

- 3. Complete the FAFSA at <u>fafsa.gov</u> on or after October 1. The FAFSA is your application for federal, state, and college-based financial aid. The colleges you list on the application will use that information to determine the types and amounts of financial aid they will award you.
- 4. Attend the EducationQuest Financial Aid Webinar at the school in October (Seniors will watch this as a class) to learn about types of financial aid and the FAFSA.
- 5. Find free FAFSA Tools at EducationQuest.org to help you prepare for and complete the FAFSA.

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
